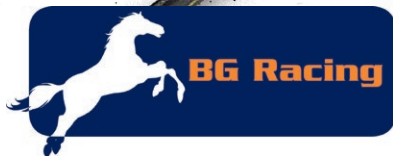

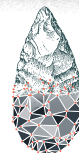

GOALIES

Mike Will

After taking over as the starter in the back stretch of last season, Will, a veteran of 6 Elite League campaigns, returns to the Flames for their first foray into the top flight. The 6'4", 190lb Lewes born puck stopper iced 1220 minutes in Flames colours while posting a 2.80 goals against average and a 90.3 save percentage across all competitions. His best contribution to that run was a 7 game playoff set when he posted a 5 win, 1 loss and 1 penalty defeat record with a 2.28 goals against average and a 92% save rate in helping the Flames to the Final 4 weekend. Will, 29, joined the side after a pair of seasons with Cardiff Devils and another 4 ahead of that at Braehead

Clan. In 5 games with Devils in 2015-2016 Will iced 155 minutes to record a 3 win and 0 loss record with a 5.81 goals against average and an 83.3 save percentage. In 9 tries the season prior, when they banked the Challenge Cup, the former Slough Jet averaged 3.20 goals against and held a 90.0 save percentage. After an early taste of EPIHL hockey with the Jets, and a handful of English National League starts with Slough Harrier Hawks, Will's development path took him to Canada where he spent the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 campaigns with Bradford Rattlers Junior Hockey club. He moved on to college in America for the following pair of terms at NCAA Division III outfit Morrisville State ahead of a return to the UK where he signed on in 2010-2011 for his 1st of 4 seasons with the Scottish based Clan.

Brian Stewart

A 2 time Elite League All-Star, and the 2014-2015 Elite League netminder of the year, the 6'5", 205lbs Canadian spent the last 3 seasons at Coventry Blaze where he helped them to the Playoff title while collecting top honours at his position. Last season, Stewart iced 51 times while posting a 3.51 goals against average and a 90 save percentage in league play. He added 8 more Cup outings where he was at 2.94 and 92 by the same metrics. His opening Blaze season was his best in the UK when he allowed just 2.68 goals per game with a 92.2 save percentage immediately following a transfer from German side EV Landshut the year prior. Before his German venture, and

after 4 years of college hockey at Northern Michigan University, the 32 year old played 3 full pro seasons in North America beginning in 2010-2011 predominantly in the East Coast Hockey League with Bakersfield Condors where his save percentage was nearly 93 while holding a stingy 2.20 goals against average. He also made 10 appearances that season at the American Hockey League Level with Adirondack Red Wings. He added brief AHL appearances in subsequent terms with Binghamton Senators and Houston Aeros and spent most of 2011-2012 at ECHL Elmira Jackals. With the Jackals, the Burnaby, British Columbia born backstopper iced 40 times while delivering a 2.56 average and 91.7 save rate. He added 40 more starts the following season back with the Condors at a 3.13 goal clip and a 91.8 save percentage. In his opening professional term, he was not short on personal recognition when he was selected as the AHL Player of the Week, the ECHL All-Rookie team and the League's All-Star game. His personal recognition during his North American run also included East Coast Goaltender of the month, Goaltender of the week and Rookie of the month awards.

Jez Lundin

Lundin, the Captain for the past 2 seasons, has spent 8 seasons under Spectrum's lights, but is not new to the country's top division. The American born British trained skater has over 160 Elite League games to his credit thanks to the bulk of 3 seasons with the Newcastle Vipers between 2006 and 2009 ahead of his Surrey transfer in time for the 2009-2010 campaign. The 6'1", 200lb Defenceman iced in 61 games last season, scoring 13 goals and adding 34 assists to go with 90 penalty minutes. In 478 career Flames starts, Lundin has 84 goals and 316 points. This season he will become just the 10th player in club history to ice 500 times with the club. The

former under 18 and 20 GB International opened his Spectrum residence as part the Premier Cup winning team. That was his first of 8 trophies including the 2010-2011 playoffs, back to back League-Cup "doubles" across 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 as well as the 2015-2016 Cup-Playoff "double". His international credits include 5 caps with the GB team that won the Gold medal at the world under 18 championships in 2006. In 2008 he had a goal and an assist for the national programme during the World Junior Under 20 tournament.

Calle Ackered

Ackered is a former Swedish Under 18 international and spent last season with Division 1 outfit Östersunds IK with whom he racked up 40 points in 39 starts to follow up a 33 point showing in 36 games the year prior with Kristianstads IK. The native of Stockholm tasted the senior circuit for the first time in 2009-2010 while still at Jr. age when he iced a couple of times with Swedish Elite League outfit Djurgårdens IF and Allsvenskan club IK Oskarshamn. The 6'0", 185lbs skater continued his Jr. career in 2010-2011 before playing his first full senior stop at Division 1 Mörrums GoIS in 2011-2012 where he had 5 goals and 6 assists in 41 outings. He moved

on to Nybro Vikings IF for the pair of following terms and added a 2014-15 stop at Vimmerby HC and Allsvenskan HC Vita Hästen. In 219 Division 1 games, Ackered has 36 goals and 155 points and has added 5 goals and 5 assists in 24 starts representing his country at under 16, 17 and 18 levels.

After nearly 450 Elite League starts, Phillips joined Spectrum's men for their final pair of seasons in the English Premier League. The Beverley native iced in all 62 games last term while scoring 7 goals and 21 points. In 126 career outings in Surrey, he has 19 goals, 29 assists, 68 penalty minutes and the Cup-Playoff "Double" from his opening campaign in 2015-2016. Phillips has more than 800 games under his belt between Flames, Belfast Giants, Braehead Clan, Hull Stingrays, Slough Jets and a brief stint with London Racers. He began his senior career in 2002-2003 with Hull Thunder of the now defunct British National League. He remained in

Hull for their conversion to Stingrays in 2004-2005, their move to the EPL the season after that, and their subsequent transfer to the EHL in 2006-2007. He joined the EPL Jets in 2007-2008 and iced nearly 100 games over a couple of seasons, registering 18 goals and 54 points while helping them to the Playoff title during his opening stint. He made his Giants debut in 2009-2010 before moving on to Braehead for the next 3 seasons ahead of a Belfast return. His Irish residency was a successful one with a Playoff title in 2009-2010 and a League championship in 2013-2014. Internationally, Phillips has a Gold medal from the 2003-2004 under 18 tournament and Under 20 Gold in '03-'04 and '05-'06. He made his senior debut on the national stage in 2004-2005 and returned to the big team in 2009-2010, experiencing 10 senior world championship caps along the way.

With experience of 150 Slovak Extraleague starts, Nechala spent last season with Amiens in France where he had a pair of goals, 6 assists and 55 penalty minutes in 35 starts. Born in Ilava, the 6'1", 210lbs blueliner's full time senior career kicked off in 2014-2015 in Skalica with whom he iced 50 games while scoring 2 goals and 10 points. In the follow up season, he iced 44 times with Dukla Trencin and 8 more with Piestany, while also tacking on 7 Slovak 2. League games with Dukla Senica and Povazska Bystrica before transferring to French quarters. The product of Trencin's development programme, Nechala wore country colours for 6 games at the Under 18

World Junior championships in 2011, and made 10 more appearances on the country's behalf in 2013, including 6 games and 2 assists at the Under 20 world tournament.

Craige transferred to Surrey fresh off helping Gap to the French Magnus League Championship. The 28 year old iced 42 games in France's top league last year, registering 3 goals and 24 points before tacking on a 1 goal and 11 assist showing in 16 playoff outings. The 5'10, 180lb blueliner made his pro debut in the Asian League with Nippon Paper Cranes in 2015-2016 where 54 games, including playoffs, yielded 5 goals and 9 assists. Prior to his overseas move, the native of Edmonton iced 5 seasons in his hometown with the University of Alberta Golden Bears where he helped with back to back National titles in 2014 and 2015 during his final 2 terms of eligibility. In

addition to major team success, Craige accepted a variety of honours including Canada West conference 1st or 2nd Team All-Star nods in 3 consecutive seasons, Most Outstanding Defenceman twice, as well as 2nd team All-Canadian selection in 2012-2013 and 1st team All-Canadian in 2014-2015. He was also on form at the University Cup National Finals when he was named to the CIS All-Tournament Team in 3 consecutive seasons between 2012-2013 and 2014-2015. His final year accolades didn't end there thanks to his selection as the top Defenceman in Canadian college hockey, and a Bronze Medal representing Canada at the World Universiade Games where he had 4 points in 6 starts. Prior to his university success, and after hoisting a League title with Fort McMurray Oil Barons of the Alberta Junior Hockey League, Craige spent 4 seasons in the Western Hockey League with Lethbridge Hurricanes and Chilliwack Bruins. In 218 Major Junior starts, he posted 27 goals and 109 points not including 7 more in 23 playoff appearances.

The 23 year old Defenceman had 6 assists last season in an injury shortened schedule that totalled 37 League and Playoff games. The 6'0", 190lb skater arrived in 2014-2015 and has since made 162 starts, scoring 3 goals and 23 points along with 152 penalty minutes. His stay includes the capture of the English Premier League Cup and Playoff "Double". The Swindon native transferred to the Flames from his hometown Wildcats with whom he spent the 2013-2014 campaign. His Premier League experience originated during 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 when he appeared 63 times with Slough Jets. He opened his senior account with the Jets National League outfit in

2011-2012, skating 27 times while registering 2 goals, 7 points and 63 penalty minutes. Internationally, Godfrey has 15 World Junior games to his credit. He iced 5 times with the under 18 side during the 2012 tournament and added 5 games each with the under 20 team in 2013 and 2014.

The Edmonton, Alberta native captained the club to last season's Canada West conference title while helping secure another trip to the National tournament for his side. In 88 conference and playoff games, Yadlowski scored 2 goals, 17 points and 178 penalty minutes while posting a plus/minus +13 rating. Yadlowski's college career followed 5 full seasons, totalling more than 300 games, of Canadian Major Junior hockey with Everett Silvertips and Lethbridge Hurricanes. The former

Canadian Pacific Under 17 player's best season in the Western Hockey League came in 2009-2010 when he posted 34 points in 70 starts. At the close of his final Jr. season he made his pro debut in the East Coast Hockey League when he made a couple of playoff appearances with Colorado Eagles before opting to accept his scholarship package with Alberta for the 2012-2013 set.

The Birmingham born, 6'2", 205lb blue liner qualifies for one of a trio of Under 23 spots open to each top flight team for this season. He spent last year, his first at senior level, at English Premier League champion Telford Tigers where he iced 62 times while recording 5 goals and 20 points along with 62 penalty minutes. Though considered British trained, Jones also has Canadian roots and has iced much of his Jr. career in North America. Prior to joining the Tigers, he spent a pair of seasons with Summerland Steam in the Kootenay International Junior Hockey League, playing just shy of 100 games while posting 32 points and more than 100 penalty minutes along the way.

In 2013-2014, following extensive development time inside Canadian borders, he iced 5 times with the GB Jr. team at the World Championships and spent his domestic season in mainland Europe with Lower Austria Stars Under 20 side who compete in the Erste Bank Young Stars League.

Davies transferred to Surrey from Elite outfit Coventry Blaze where he had 4 goals and 14 points in 39 starts in 2016-2017. His season included a 10 point opening run in 6 games with Swindon Wildcats, and a 5 game overseas tour with East Coast Hockey League franchise Norfolk Admirals. Davies is a veteran of 500 games with Cardiff Devils, Braehead Clan, and last season's stop at Blaze. During his Elite league stretch, the 5'8", 180lb forward bagged 84 goals and added 137 assists for a 221 point career total. His best top flight season to date was during the 2011-2012 campaign in which the Cardiff born skater iced 54 games with his hometown side while scoring 12

goals and 34 points. The product of the Cardiff Jr. Programme opened his Devils account while still under 18 in 2007-2008 when he iced 25 times. He increased his contribution over the years to come, spending the bulk of the next 6 terms with the Welsh outfit before a two year tour with the Clan in 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 where he iced over 100 times while recording nearly 60 points. In addition to his domestic duties, Davies added Champions Hockey League experience to his resume during his 2nd Scottish season when he played 4 games in the European club event. With the National programme, Davies has 13 starts with team GB, icing at the world championships in 2013 and 2014, as well as a 3 game Olympic Qualifier representation in 2016. He also wore country colours at the Jr. level with the Under 18's and 20's with whom he racked up 25 combined caps from 2007 through 2011.

That year also marked his senior debut with 28 games at AIK of the Swedish Hockey League, that country's top flight, and one of the world's finest domestic leagues. He added 14 more starts with them the next season before taking on a full time role at Division 1 Huddinge IK with whom 41 games yielded 48 points from 14 goals and 34 assists. He moved up to Allsvenskan outfit AIK in 2014-2015, scoring 5 goals and 7 points over 49 appearances before a 20 point stop in 2015-2016 at Division 1 Kallinge/Ronneby IF. In 107 Division 1 games, the 5'11", 190lb skater has 31 goals and 81 assists for better than a point a game pace.

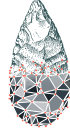

In 5 seasons of minor pro hockey, Watters has spent the last 4 with Reading Royals in the East Coast Hockey League. In 223 ECHL starts, including his opening year split with Orlando Solar Bears and Idaho Steelheads, the 5'11", 200lbs winger has 27 goals and 95 points to go with 228 penalty minutes. He also added 7 points in 25 playoff outings. Last season, Watters iced 59 times, including playoffs, and had 7 goals and 18 helpers. Prior to his jump to the professional ranks, the native of Pickering, Ontario spent 3 full seasons with Brampton Battalion in Canada's Major Junior Ontario Hockey League where he amassed 45 goals and 97 points in 161 starts. His best season

was 2011-2012 when he was nearly a point a game skater over a 42 game stretch that saw him capture 18 goals and 17 assists during the regular schedule and the playoffs, while also taking his team's player of the year honours. The former alternate captain for Battalion and Royals led the latter in shots on goal in 2015-2016 and was named his club's defensive player of the year in the same season.

This is Campbell's 8th consecutive term at Spectrum, and his first in the top flight since he arrived in Surrey from Newcastle Vipers at the close of the 2009-2010 campaign. He made 61 starts last season while leading the club in scoring with a career high 39 goals and 76 points. He has been a part of 7 trophies during his Guildford stay including the 2015-2016 Cup-Playoff "Double", back to back League and Cup titles across 2011-2012 and 2012-2013, and a playoff championship during his first campaign with the club in 2010-2011. The 5'10", 170lbs skater entered the season just one game shy of 400 at Flames and sits 15th on the club's all-time points

list with 140 goals and 329 points. Prior to signing on with Surrey's side, Campbell's 3 seasons at Vipers yielded 27 goals and 66 points in just under 250 games.

Prior to departing his homeland, the native of Luleå had spent his entire Jr. and pro career in domestic service with 154 games in the country's top flight Swedish Hockey League and another 219 starts just a tier down from that. 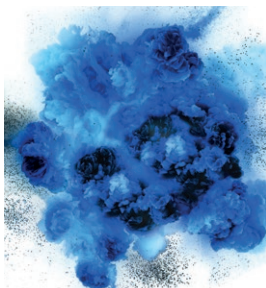
